3. All entries must be removed by 12:00 noon on Sunday.
4. The Flower Show Committee assumes no responsibility for loss or damages to property.
5. All entrants must register with the Classification Committee and receive an entry card prior to displaying entries.
6. Judges decisions are final.

AWARDS: First, Second, Third, & Honorable Mention may be given in each Class or Class Subdivision.

CLASS 8100 - HORTICULTURE

1. All entries must be grown by the exhibitor and must have been in his/her possession at least three (3) months.
2. All entries should be labeled as to variety, whenever possible.
3. Exhibitors may enter in as many classes as desired, but are limited to one entry in each class or sub-class as to kind, variety, and/or color.
4. Specimens must be well groomed & free of dirt, insects, and spray residue.
5. No dressings, such as polish or oils are allowed on foliage of any exhibit.
6. Self-foliage may be placed with blooms that do not bear leaves on a flower stem.
7. The plant in any class of horticulture rates better if self foliage is included.
8. Exhibitors are requested to provide their own containers. (Coke bottles work well.)
9. These same rules apply to the Junior Class.
